

## 780 Evening Cape in Lacy Crochet

ROYAL SOCIETY Cordichet 6 Balls No. 30 13 Balls No. 40

Crochet Hook No. 9 1/2 Yard 3/4" Ribbon 2 Yards 3" Ribbon

With White Cordichet Size 30. Ch 338. Make I dtr in 8th ch from hook, \* ch 2, sk I ch, I dtr next ch, repeat from \* for length of foundation ch. (166 sps). 2nd row, Ch 8, turn, I dtr in 1st sp, \* ch 2, I dtr in next sp. Repeat from \* across. Repeat 2nd row for 5 rows.

To increase. Make ch 2, I dtr in same sp as last dtr. Continue as before, but increase as follows:

8th row: Increase in every 11th sp (15 increases). 10th row: Increase in every 12th sp (15 increases).

12th row: Repeat 10th row (16 increases). 14th row Increase in every 11th sp (19 increases).

16th and 18th rows: Repeat 14th row (21 and 22 increases).

20th row: Repeat 10th row (22 increases).

22nd row: Increase every 13th sp (22 increases).

24th row: Increase every 15th sp (21 increases). 26th row: Increase every 17th sp (19 increases).

Make 2 rows without increasing, then finish off. Neck Frill: Use White Cordichet size 40 for all frills. Attach thread at end of foundation ch, \* ch 5, I sc in 1st sp, repeat from \* 4 times, then ch 5, sk I sp,

put I sc in next sp and repeat from first \* across. 2nd row: Ch 5, turn, I sc in 1st loop, \* ch 5, I sc next loop, repeat from \* across.

Repeat 2nd row for 7 rows, then finish off.

For Frills on Cape: Fold along edge of 4th row. This brings posts of 5th row, half way between posts of 4th row, and makes double the number of sps. Attach thread in 1st sp, \* ch 5, sk I post, I sc in next sp, and repeat from \* but sk 2 posts in every 15th

Repeat 2nd row of neck frill for 8 rows, (9 rows in all) then finish off.

Make similar frills at the edges of the 8th, 12th, 16th, 20th and 24th rows.

Bottom Frill: Attach thread at end of lower edge. \* Ch 5, put I sc in next sp, and repeat from \* 5 times. Ch 5, I sc in same sp as last sc. Repeat from 1st \* to end of row then finish off.

Double the narrow ribbon and draw it through the 1st row of sps, under and over 3 posts at a time. Draw up so that the cape hangs comfortably around the neck and fasten at the 2 ends. Cut the moire in half and attach to the 2 ends of the narrow ribbon.
